I PRAYED TO BE SAVED... WHAT'S NEXT?

SO MUCH TO BE EXCITED ABOUT!

There is nothing more important or more exciting than becoming a follower of Jesus Christ - being saved!

God's promise is clear: "Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ and you will be saved." (Acts 16:31)

John 3:16 explains, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

When we're saved, our future in heaven, our "everlasting life," is forever secure: "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." (Romans 10:13) Not might, hopefully, probably, or possibly saved, but "WILL be saved." Eternal salvation comes when we "believe" in Jesus.

This is an absolutely wonderful promise from God. However, it is not the end of the adventure. In fact, the amazing journey has just begun!

Being a true Christ-follower means so much more than praying a prayer for salvation. It means being a disciple of Jesus.

HOLD ON...WHAT IS A DISCIPLE?

GREAT QUESTION!

A disciple is a devoted follower. In Bible times, to be a disciple meant to imitate a "rabbi" or mentor and then teach and guide others to do the same.

The Apostle Paul wrote about this saying, "For those whom he foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the image of his Son." (Romans 8:29)

Disciples of Jesus should think as He thinks, love what He loves, hate what He hates and do His works.

In short: A disciple is a person who is becoming conformed in every way to the image of Christ.



WHAT IS MY NEXT STEP TO BEING A DISCIPLE?

Being a "disciple" or a "devoted follower" of Jesus is the big picture. But what exactly does that look like? What does someone do after they are saved?

Jesus said that we are to make disciples and, "Teach them to obey everything I have commanded you to do." (Matthew 28:20). Here is a partial list of what Jesus commanded us to do:

- Get baptized
- Resist temptations to do wrong
- Mentor others
- Share about Jesus
- Pray
- Participate in local church
- Submit to Jesus as Lord (boss)
- Celebrate communion regularly
- Sacrificially serve others
- Live unashamed of Jesus
- Overcome discouragements
- Praise and worship God
- Be filled with Holy Spirit

- Help new believers
- Study the Bible daily
- Oppose false teaching
- Humbly submit to others
- Follow God's special calling
- Trust God, no matter what
- Persevere in the storms of life
- And more...


THE BRIDGE ILLUSTRATION

NOTE: The reference to Moses lifting up a serpent in the wilderness refers to a plague where poisonous snakes were killing many Israelites. (Numbers 21:6-9) The miraculous solution God brought was that a brass serpent was fashioned and put on a pole (like a cross). When the Israelites looked in faith at the serpent, they were miraculously healed--a wonderful symbol of Jesus being lifted up on the cross.
